Go with Einstein challenge to ensure Gandhi's legacy: Modi

New Delhi/Ahmedabad, 2 October

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday paid his respects to Mahatma Gandhi at the latter's memorial at Rajghat in the national capital and at the Sabarmati Ashram in Ahmedabad in the evening, where the local unit of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) felicitated the PM for his "successful" visit to the US.

Addressing BJP workers at the Ahmedabad airport, the PM said India's image has gained global prominence. He said the world expected India to play a leading role in resolving international problems. He highlighted the importance of US President Donald Trump attending the 'Howdy Modi' event in Houston.

Modi said during his visit world leaders paid Gandhi "real tributes" at the United Nations. "Gandhi was with us, is with us and will be there for future generations," he said.

In an op-ed published in *The New York Times*, Prime Minister Narendra Modi proposed what he called the 'Einstein Challenge' to ensure Mahatma Gandhi's ideals are remembered by future generations.

Modi described Gandhi as the "best teacher", "the guiding light" who continues to give courage to millions globally, and uniting those who believe in humanity.

"As a tribute to Gandhi, I propose what I call the Einstein Challenge. We know Albert Einstein's famous words on Gandhi: 'Generations to come will scarce believe that such a one as this ever in flesh and blood walked upon this earth!'" Modi wrote in the op-ed titled 'Why India and the World Need Gandhi'.

"How do we ensure the ideals of Gandhi are remem-

bered by future generations? I invite thinkers, entrepreneurs and tech leaders to be at the forefront of spreading Gandhi's ideas through innovation." The op-ed ends with a call to the world to work shoulder to shoulder to end hate, violence and suffering.

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh unveiled a statue of Gandhi at Delhi Cantonment

on Wednesday. Speaking at the BJP's Sankalp Yatra in Delhi, Environment and Forests Minister Prakash Javadekar said India produces 30,000 tonnes of single-use plastic waste every day, of this 20,000 tonnes are picked up but the remaining 10,000 tonnes stay back for many years in open spaces. "It chokes drains, it's harmful for both humans and

animals. The cattle consume it and die. Single-use plastic should be avoided," he said.

At the launch of a tourism festival in the capital, Tourism Minister Prahlad Patel on Wednesday announced that single-use plastic will not be allowed on the premises of historical monuments and within 100 metres of them. The government has shelved the plan

to outlaw single-use plastics on the 150th anniversary of the birth of Mahatma Gandhi, with government sources pointing to its disruptive consequences for the industry.

Earlier in the day, the PM tweeted his homage to Gandhi. "We pledge to continue working hard to realise his dreams and create a better planet," Modi tweeted.

In a short video on Gandhi, Modi said his message of peace is still relevant to the world community. He referred to the seven perversions Gandhi had cautioned people about - wealth without work, pleasure without conscience, knowledge without character, visit without ethics, science without humanity, religion without sacrifice and politics without principles.

BJP President Amit Shah flagged off a four-month exercise in which party leaders across the country will undertake foot marches and address public events to mark his 150th birth anniversary.

Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) chief Mohan Bhagwat said Gandhi had visited an RSS shakha in Delhi during the time of partition, interacted with swayamsevaks (volunteers) and expressed joy over their discipline and the absence of divisive feelings over caste and creed among them.

"Its report was published in the *Harjan*, dated September 27, 1947. Gandhi expressed his joy over the discipline of the Sangh swayamsevaks and complete absence of divisive feelings of caste and creed in them," Bhagwat said in an article posted on the RSS website.

Gandhi had also visited a Sangh camp near Wardha in 1936 and the next day RSS founder Dr Hedgewar met him at his Ashram. The contents of the long question-answer session and discussion are now in public domain, he said.

Only Congress walked the path shown by Babu: Sonia

A day after it had welcomed the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) for commemorating Mahatma Gandhi's 150th birth anniversary as a sign of the party's "penance", the Congress on Wednesday staked claim to the ideological and political legacy of the Father of the Nation by taking out padyatras at several places across the country.

Addressing party workers at Rajghat, the Mahatma's memorial in the national capital, Congress President Sonia Gandhi criticised the Sangh Parivar for trying to appropriate Gandhian legacy, and said only the Congress has walked on the path shown by Babu to work for the welfare of the people, create jobs, educational opportunities and help to farmers.

"How can those who pursue the politics of falsehood understand that Gandhi was the worshipper of truth? How can those who can do anything for power understand that Gandhi was a worshipper of non-violence? How can those thirsty for power understand the meaning of Gandhi's Swaraj? Those who claim to be supreme at the first opportunity, how can

they understand the value of selfless service of Gandhi?" she asked.

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi led a march of party workers to the Mahatma's memorial at Rajghat in the national capital, where Congress president Sonia Gandhi addressed them and administered an oath. Congress General Secretary Priyanka Gandhi Vadra led a march in Lucknow. The Congress termed its padyatras Gandhi sandesh yatras.

Alluding to RSS Chief Mohan Bhagwat's recent statement, Sonia said India and Gandhi are synonymous with each other, and some people are adamant on reversing this.

"They want the RSS and not Gandhi to become the symbol of India," she said. "I want to tell them clearly... there cannot be any thought except Gandhi's all-inclusive system, that includes the composite culture, civilisation and society of India," she said.

In Lucknow, Priyanka Gandhi Vadra said the BJP should first pursue the path of truth and then talk about Gandhi. "Atrocities are being committed against women, especially in Uttar Pradesh. Rapists are being protected. It is our demand that in the Shahjahanpur incident, a rape case should be registered against the accused," Priyanka Gandhi Vadra said.

Left relooks at Mahatma's contribution

The Communist Party of India (Marxist) marked Mahatma Gandhi's birth anniversary by inaugurating a school in the national capital to train its cadres, and admitting that it has reexamined its view on the contribution of the Father of the Nation.

CPI(M) chief Sitaram Yechury, along with other party leaders, inaugurated the Surjeet Bhavan, named after late Harkishan Singh Surjeet, by paying tributes to

a portrait of Surjeet as also that of Gandhi in the auditorium of the newly constructed building.

In an article in the latest edition of party mouthpiece "Peoples Democracy" to be published later this week, Yechury has said all that Gandhi stood for as the leader of India's freedom struggle is now coming under assault, including his anti-imperialism, upholding secularism; his struggles against untouchability and for social justice.

"Notwithstanding the political differences between

Communists and Mahatma, during the ups and downs of the freedom struggle, his adherence to the above principles is both acknowledged and noted," Yechury has said.

"Whatever many say about his espousing khadi and the spinning wheel (charkha) as being 'anti-modern', the fact remains that economic self-reliance and the protection of our economic sovereignty in this age of neo-liberalisation; and, the Modi government's aggressive pursuit of the same, remains an important aspect," Yechury has written.
